



he Nicholasville facility was built in 1979 under the name of Norris Industries. Production began in 1980, with 25 employees.

The plant had a total of 125,000 square feet, with a three shift operation in tubing, and two shifts in plastic injection molding. Shortly after its opening, the plater and paint departments were added, and all departments ran three shifts, seven days per week.

In 1982 the name was changed to NI Industries. In 1985, an additional 11,000 square feet were added to hold the robot operation for the tail lamps. In 1986, the company had expanded to approximately 400 employees. At that time, the new tube mill was built and the tubing operation was moved to the new location next door.

From 1989 through the end of 1990, many changes occurred at the plant;

the old plater was removed, a new waste treatment system was built, a new paint room built, a rack strip operation was added, and the Nicholasville plant went strictly to the manufacturing of automotive wheel trim, and again, a new name change to Norris Trim.

In 1991, the wheel trim division was purchased by Thompson International, and was separated from the tubing facility.

During that time, the company began TQM and Continuous Improvement projects with an emphasis on employee involvement.

The company was acquired by McKechnie PLC with sales aggregating approximately one billion in January 1996. McKechnie PLC was based out of England and traded on the London Stock Exchange. The Nicholasville

facility, under McKechnie Vehicle Components (MVC), evolved over the next 10 years with manufacturing capabilities in decorated exterior trim products for the U.S. automotive industry, principally coated plastic wheel trims.

McKechnie PLC was subsequently purchased by Melrose PLC in May 2005. MVC as a business was successful in obtaining orders for high growth wheel-cladding products.

Nicholasville was chosen as the location for production of chrome-plated plastic cladding with "Urethane Foam Attachment" to the wheel.

A successful introduction in September 2007 of the new chrome plating line at Nicholasville was critical in enabling MVC to meet the high level of contracted orders from customers for the new plasticlad production.

In addition, significant improvements have been made in the wheel assembly process at Nicholasville which bode well for our new product launches in 2008.

Nicholasville currently paints 30,000 wheel covers and 7,500 hub caps per day. In addition, 5,000 daily plasticlad are produced and shipped to our customers.


